Abstract

In contemporary times, one of the research fields of linguistics is the study of women's language. With the expansion of the branches of linguistics and the studies conducted in the field of women, linguists have come to the conclusion that there are fundamental differences between the language of women and men, and these linguistic differences have caused differences in writing.
