The Manifestations of City in the Novels of Ghada al-Saman and Ghazaleh Alizadeh

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Abstract

This research deals with the representations of the city in the novels of Ghada al-Saman, Syrian-Lebanese writer and Ghazaleh Alizadeh, Iranian writer. The research deals with Ghada al-Saman's novels including Beirut 75, Beirut nightmares, The Eve of Billion and The Impossible Novel – Damascene Mosaic as well as Ghazaleh Alizadeh's novels including Two Views, Idrisis House, and Tehran Nights. The researchers try to see what representations and reflections the city has in the novels of two writers. At the end of the research, it reveals that the reviewed novels show the hidden and the visible images of the two cities of Beirut and Tehran, and they question the trend of renovation and modernization in Iranian cities and Arab countries which have taken anti-nature and cement faces.
